Why Open and Affirming?

As many know, we have recently begun a process to consider becoming an Open and Affirming church. Open and Affirming is a designation of the United Church of Christ which declares that a congregation has taken the time to discuss and come to an understanding about how they will receive and accept groups of people who have at times been judged, excluded, or harmed by the Christian church. The end goal of this process is a clear statement of openness and affirmation for specific groups of people. This statement is to be voted on by the membership.

I have appreciated the honesty of many people as we have begun this process. Some have asked, "Why do we need to go through such a process? Are we not already open and affirming?" Others have expressed the concern that such a process seems to be related only to one sort of group – namely gays, lesbians, and transgender. "Why so much focus on a group that makes up only 3% to 5% of the population?" Some also have expressed the concern that our going through this process might be divisive. Still others have said, "It's about time!"

I believe it important to state a few of the reasons I believe this process is important for our congregation at this time in our life together. I want to begin by saying that the process is not only about gays, lesbians, and transgender folks. The process is our way of being intentional in understanding what we mean when we say, "No matter who you are or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome in this place." This includes not only gays, lesbians, and transgender, but also people who are economically challenged, mentally and/or physically handicapped, differing racial backgrounds, and non-traditional families.

It is true that in our denomination the process originally began with a focus on gays, lesbians, and transgender. Another essential purpose for our process is that people who have been unwelcome and hurt by churches before will not come unless they know a church is truly welcoming and affirming of them. We all know what it means to feel unwelcome, judged, and excluded. How easily will any of us return to a place where we have had a painful experience of rejection or being misunderstood? We likely would not return unless we were given an extravagant welcome and knew that a group of people truly cared enough to reach out with intention.

I also believe St. Matthew is a church that wants to make an extravagant welcome. We are like a family with one another and it is our character to welcome and affirm people who come into our presence. Families need at times to have open discussions to talk about who they are together and how they wish to live in the world. That is what this process is about. As in any family we likely will not all come to the same conclusion, but it is essential that we hold to the same love and respect for one another.

Finally, a church's greatest call is to make a faithful witness to the person and the way of Jesus Christ. The larger church's witness in the world unfortunately has, at times, become a negative one: judgmental, legalistic, and hurtful. I come from a state, Mississippi, where during racial injustice and brutality few were willing to speak for the way of Christ. I know the cost of that silence to human lives, to the people who remained silent, and to the church's witness. I hope our witness will be that the church is not about judgment and exclusion, but an extravagant welcome.

I have a confidence that rather than pushing people away from our church, we will become more inviting and attractive because we reflect the love of Jesus.

I hope you will attend the forum that we are hosting after worship on November 1st to discuss our process. I also hope you will be in worship on November 15th and 22nd. On November 15th, I will be preaching on the idea of hospitality to people "no matter who they or where they are on life's journey." On November 22nd, I simply want to share my own story in coming to terms with gays and lesbians and how my understanding of scripture shaped changes in my attitudes.


