Breaking Bread in Unexpected Places

"When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight. They asked each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?"

Luke 24:30-32

The strangest thing happened last January when I attended the United Church of Christ Senior Pastors' conference in Florida. Just so unexpected. It is late at night at the conference and two of the pastors and I are sitting around in the hospitality room that is just on the edge of the beach with the doors wide open. We are enjoying ourselves drinking wine and shooting the breeze when an attractive young adult woman comes off the beach into the room. She says, "Hey, what's up? You got a party going on here?" Somewhat amused at the situation, we all say, "Sure, why don't you join us." She says, "I'm with a bunch of my friends and we have been out on the beach, what are you here for?" We explain that we are pastors at a conference. She laughs and says, "Well, that is not what I expected. But it's funny that I walked in here and find three pastor, because I was just doing something I never do. I was reading a Bible. Something about someone walking on water or something like that. It's a really weird book." One of us says something about the story being the way God comes to us when we are going through a stormy time.

Then she tells us about her life and how she dropped out of completing training as an addiction counselor because she became so discouraged by all the people who do not really want to help.

I could hear in her story someone really searching. One of the other ministers says, "You know, you are really gifted; you are smart, you listen well, you care for people enough to let them affect you, you are going to be really great when you figure out what you want to do."

This was such a strange interaction in an unexpected place. We are breaking bread and sharing wine, and the communion table was just made larger. I will never know what happened to her and what came of our having crossed the same paths. But I have the sense that bread was broken and a cup was shared and Jesus, just as He promised us, made Himself present.

One of the reasons we break bread and share the cup in worship during holy communion is to be reminded that the ordinary bread we break and the cup we share in our daily lives is also a time when Christ comes to be with us. In the ordinary conversations, Christ is present and at work through us. The real issue is whether we will be present to Jesus in the ordinary moments of our lives. Will we have a sense that the moment we share with others can become a moment in which we make a difference in someone's life and they in our lives? May we seek out such moments, invite others to Jesus' table, whether it be the one in our sanctuary or the one out and about town.

- 3. It will help to strengthen our congregation in our continued evolution and renewal as we move forward together to identify and act on issues that matter most to our congregation and community.

We are looking for 5-10 volunteers, and we invite those who are interested in joining this ministry to attend the CRS Annual Membership Assembly on Saturday, October 5th to celebrate our membership in CRS, worship with other CRS churches, and learn more about this program. 
This effort will not have any pictures for sale and will result in both a printed directory and an online version of that directory.

Our regular visitor are encouraged to submit a photo and information for the directory. We'd like to get to know you!



Why Do We Do Pet Blessings?

On Sunday, October 13, at 2:00 p.m., you will notice something a bit odd if you come by the church. You will see a procession of people coming into the church with pets in hand or on leash or in a cage making their way to the church fellowship hall for a pet blessing. This tradition is done in remembrance of St. Francis and his love for all creatures, great and small. October is the month we usually share in this ritual because it comes near St. Francis' feast day, October 4. St. Francis is famous for his being one to whom the animals would gather around to hear his preaching and receive his blessing.

He is also the one who wrote a Canticle of the Creatures, an ode to God's living things. "All praise to you, Oh Lord, for all these brother and sister creatures." His love of creation was not sentimentality, but a deep felt recognition that we are knitted together as a creation and that each member of creation blesses their creator for the gift of life.

In a time when we have so much bad news, the beauty of creation is a constant reminder of the underlying goodness of life. We only need to slow down and take a walk on a beautiful Fall day to be reminded of the grandeur of the creation that reflects the mystery of our creator.

When we bless the animals who have become a part of our families, church becomes the place where we celebrate our bond with the creation. Our church also becomes a place where we reaffirm how in Christ the whole of creation is held together and sustained by his gracious love. We then are reminded that from the beginning we were created to be God's partners in caring for the creation.

Join us on October 13, with or without an animal, to hear the blessing of all God's creation: "Blessed are you, Lord God, maker of all living creatures. You called forth fish in the sea, birds in the air and animals on the land. You inspired St. Francis to call all of them his brothers and sisters. We ask you to bless these pets. By the power of your love, enable them to live according to your plan. May we always praise you for all your beauty in creation. Blessed are you, Lord our God, in all your creatures! Amen."

Why Should Our Church Make Use of Video in Worship?

For several years the leadership of St. Matthew has considered adding the necessary equipment for the use of video in our worship services. We have received bids and are working to present to Church Council and the congregation the most affordable and adequate system (possibly along with new lighting and audio). I believe it is important for me to share with you why I believe it is time for our church to take these steps in new technology.

Video is one way we can show hospitality to guests of our church, many of whom are used to such technology in other churches with which they have been associated, and it is one way to help our guests more easily follow along with the flow of our worship experience.

Video greatly aids congregational singing, as it encourages worshippers to look up while they are singing. Hymn books will still be available, especially for those who find them more comfortable and who read music. New hymns/songs can also be added to the bulletin for those who like to hold the music.

Video provides a way to incorporate art and beauty into our worship and to establish the theme as a part of the sermon and allows us to heighten the congregation's use of their senses of sight and hearing.

Video is one way our youth and children can more regularly be a part of our worship, as they can contribute art or produce video skits that can greatly enhance the service or the sermon.

Video can be used to make announcements more efficiently.

Video is a way we can blend our service to include a more contemporary style while maintaining the best aspects of traditional worship.

Video can be used to celebrate church experiences (mission trips, etc.) and enhance congregational meetings.


