### Pastoral Message

Pastor Allen Mothershed

### "Do Not Be Afraid"

This Advent season and through Christmas Eve we will be focusing on the message of the angel Gabriel to Zechariah, Mary, Joseph, and the shepherds. Have you ever noticed how the angel says the same line every time, "Do not be afraid"? Of course, he says this because everyone to whom he appears is terrified. If you read on in the gospel accounts, Jesus says something very close to this when He appears to the disciples. When Jesus greets frightened disciples walking on the water, and later as the resurrected Christ, He says, "Peace be with you!"

It has occurred to me that both of these messages, "Do not be afraid" and "Peace be with you", are exactly the messages we need to receive from God this Advent and Christmas season. We are a very frightened people, and we are not very much at peace. We are a divided nation, a people in a war of words with each other. Kindness and any attempt to hear one another has all but been forgotten. We huddle together with those who agree with us and blame the other side for all our problems. Indeed, blame can be readily found. But the blame game plays into the cycle of fear and anger that seems to have no end.

Maybe the gift we most need to receive this Christmas is the peace of Christ that puts our fears at rest and provides a way to make peace with each other. His peace is not an absence of conflict but a deep assurance of our value to God, and a realization that even our enemies are made in the image of God just as we are. Reclaiming our common humanity is the beginning of peace.

The Good News is a child, a vulnerable child, is born into the world from poor parents to remind all of us of how beloved we each are to the One who created us. May we be beloved to each other. Amen.




