Come Together Right Now

As a child I looked forward to Saturday evenings when my father would hand over my weekly allowance. Seems to me that it was rather meager. I think it was 75 cents, eventually went up to a dollar, and stayed there until at age 11 when I started to work at his retail store and made some "real money" at minimum wage. At that time it was enough for me to have coins in my pocket and the ability to walk down to the Five and Dime store for more bubble gum than I could chew in a week. Sometimes I'd save up and spurge on an apple fried pie or a Twinkie or maybe a cheap toy.

But always, on Sunday morning I would watch the offering plate being passed down the aisle and my dad would put in several bills of money and once a month his monthly pledge. I was taught to give ten percent. So I'd place after him my small coins in the plate, often a collection of pennies. One time I asked him why it was so important for me to give my little bit of money. What difference did it make? He looked at me astonished like I had just been swearing in front of him. He said, "Son, what you put in that plate is as important as what everyone else puts in that plate." I had a puzzled look of disbelief on my face and so he continued, "When you give you say you are a member of God's family and you are committed to the good of the rest of the family."

We rarely appreciate how important we are to one another. We have a way of underestimating our value to the rest of our faith family and to God. Our giving of self or wealth is our way of remembering that each of us is of immeasurable value. Our giving is our way of doing our part for the good of the rest of the family.

I invite you in this time of stewardship to reflect on your importance to the whole of God's family at St. Matthew. Our theme this year is "Come Together, Right Now, Over Me." May this be such a time for doing just that.

In 2001, while on a mission trip to Honduras, a group from St. Matthew met the Guzman family. Catalina Guzman, a single mother, was raising her 3 children – Claudeth, Cinthia and Daniel – in a mountain shack (photos 1,2). A group returned in 2004 to build the Guzman family home (photo 3). That same year, with the help of sponsors and the congregation via the mission fund, we began sending Claudeth and Daniel to a private bilingual school. Six years later, in 2010, we attended Daniel's 6th grade graduation (photo 4). In 2011 we returned to build a safety wall around the Guzman home (photo 5). In the winter of 2014 Daniel came to visit us at St. Matthew while on a class trip (photo 6). This year, it is our hope that Claudeth will be able to visit while on her class trip. This past June, because of the generosity of St. Matthew, Daniel graduated from the Albert Einstein International School of San Pedro Sula Honduras (photo 7). Dear St. Matthew friends,



Opening and Affirming Update

As mentioned in the September edition of The Voice, at the direction of the church council we have begun a process of exploring whether to recommend that St. Matthew officially become an Open and Affirming church. "Open and Affirming" is a formal designation for a congregation that has adopted a specific statement of openness and affirmation towards those who have in the past been hurt and excluded by the Christian church.

The committee consists of Lee Staton (committee chair), Alex Alavi, Jennifer Buhmann, Carol Honeywell, Diane Mook, Leslie Ortman, and Dorothy Peterson, with Pastor Allen overseeing our efforts. We have begun discussions on some of the questions that have been raised so far, such as "Why do we need to go through the formal process?" There are several possible answers, such as reassuring those who may feel excluded from the Christian community that we welcome and accept them as they are, and a desire to publicly offer an alternative voice to long-held prejudices within the religious world. We are eager to share our discussions with you and to continue receiving input, so we encourage you to talk to Pastor Allen or to anyone on the exploration committee regarding questions or feedback you may have.

Mark your calendars to attend a discussion forum after the worship service on November 1st. As the exploration continues, the congregation will have the final decision on how to proceed, so your input is a valuable part of this process.

The Bible: Encountering Scripture in New Ways

This fall we are holding a series of engaging studies to invigorate and deepen understanding of the Bible as we learn how to make it relevant for our lives. We are engaging in a video-based study of the Bible at the church on Thursday evenings at 7pm. The sessions are thoughtful, edgy, and present interesting ideas. Driver Job for Marian Park




