The Choice

Maybe you have had the same experience that I have: Sometimes I hear words coming out of the mouth of Christian religious leaders that leave me appalled and wondering, "How is it that we worship and follow the same Jesus? How can we be brothers and sisters of the faith and have an entirely different view of the Good News of Jesus the Christ? Are we practicing two different religions?"

Increasingly, we live in divisive times. The culture wars of our society are front and center and we are asked to choose which side we are going to take. Many who would rather keep politics out of religion are being asked to choose who they will serve and who they will support. Do we support abortion rights or not? Do we embrace a more receptive and merciful immigration policy or not? Are you a Bible-believing Christian who stands against the perversion of gay, lesbian, and transgender rights or are you one of those liberals who believe in a radically inclusive God? Is our country somehow God's chosen nation or do you believe that God's kingdom includes all the people of the world and stands in judgment of all nations?

It is sad that we have come to this, but perhaps it was inevitable. We have had a false divide between our personal walk with Jesus and social justice. I believe the same God who has shown me mercy and compassion and who calls me to live a righteous (just) life in my personal walk is the same God who has compassion and demands justice in our world. The love and forgiveness of God which I know in my personal life is the same love that guides me on the great issues of our day. How do I know about this love? I know about it through my walk with God, and also from the scriptures.

The real choice we have to make goes to a deeper level than deciding where we stand on the dominant social issues of our day. This has to do with how we read and understand our scriptures. I do not read the scriptures as the literal Word of God, written by the hand of God as an eternal law relevant in the same way for all people and all time. People used to quote to me, "God is the same yesterday, today and tomorrow!" "Yes," I agree, "But God's Word to us is a living word spoken anew to us in our own time and place. (cont.)

The scriptures are not an eternal law book to be enforced (usually on other people I judge) by the church against transgressors. The scriptures are the vast and varied experiences of God by people from different times and places. The Word of God is not the text of scripture, but the Word that God is speaking through the pages of scripture in my time and place."


Conservative Christians will say that this leads to a permissiveness in the Christian life and is a dangerous liberty sought by those who seek to justify "doing their own thing." But no one said being Christian is going to be an easy path to follow. We live in the realm of grace and not law, the Apostle Paul tells us. We must take responsibility to dare and believe *God is Still Speaking*. Scripture is not a dead book, it is a living document brought to life by the One who speaks through it. The Bible can become idolatrous, a desire for absolutes, rather than following daily the God we know as merciful and just. It can become a weapon to be used against those whose values contradict my own culturally defined values. When I see the Bible being used to judge people not like myself, to back up racism, sexism, and prejudice towards people born with a different sexual orientation, I see the bad fruits of a perspective on the Bible that does not dare to trust that God is alive in my life and speak to our time the Word we are now able to hear.

Jesus said the law of God is summed up in love of God and love of the neighbor as the self. Do we believe this? Are we guided by this? Or do we just give it lip service? We have to first choose how we understand our scripture and then let the Spirit of God guide us with God's mercy and compassion that is formed in us when we have experienced such extravagant love.

BACK BAY MISSION TRIP





gling to reconcile their responsibilities and desires." (Tom Perrotta)




