Pastoral Message

Pastor Allen Mothershed

In a culture that encourages us to be upbeat and happy and to appear to "be together," we need a safe way to acknowledge to ourselves, to each other, and to God that there are other aspects to being a human being. The season of Lent makes allowances for us to name, claim, and to experience our darker emotions. We are encouraged to take an honest look at our lives and to name how we are falling short of our best selves. We are given permission by God's grace to be imperfect human beings and to name our failures to have compassion for those who are weak, forgiveness for those who have hurt us, and to work for justice in our world. Therefore, Lent permits us to be sad, regretful, angry, and to grieve. This can be seen as a downer, but more helpful is to see that Lent offers us a freedom to be real and stop the pretending to ourselves and others that we are somebody we are not. The truth sets us free to experience God's grace and love for us despite not having it all together.

Therefore, in Lent, we sing some somber songs with words that can become prayers of repentance and regret and lead to our forgiveness. We hear the stories of Jesus' passion, how He loved His friends and enemies, and was faithful to God, even to the point of death on a cross. In so doing, Jesus is showing us what it means to be fully human. In the same stories of Jesus' passion, we also see ourselves in the failure of the disciples and are offered the grace to embrace our imperfections and to be forgiven.

Each liturgical year, on Ash Wednesday (February 26th this year), we begin the season of Lent with the imposition of ashes. The ashes are placed on the back of the hand or the forehead to remind us that from dust we have come and to dust we shall return. This is a reminder that we are not self-sufficient and invulnerable. We do not need to be God. We need only to embrace, with love, our lives, and the person we are. This is also a reminder that life is short, and that death is an inevitable part of life. By embracing death, we learn to embrace the gift of each day. It is in this way that Lent is an invitation to a fuller and fulfilling life.

I pray that each of you will enter this year's Lenten experience with great intention through personal devotion and participation in worship. Only when we walk with sadness with Jesus to the cross will we be able to meet Him with joy at the empty tomb.







The Green Team
