Pastoral Message Rev. Allen Mothershed

Do you ever have a morning when you wake up anxious about your day? Maybe you have spent the night tossing and turning and worrying about things. Perhaps you even give up and get out of bed in the middle of the night and write out a plan of what you are going to do the next day to alleviate your anxious concerns.

I recently read an article by Anthony B. Robinson that helped me. He pointed out something I had noticed before in the Bible, but never gave much thought to its significance. He notes how in the Bible a day begins with one evening and ends the next evening. A day is not from morning to evening. A night and a day make "a day." This means that a day begins before we wake up. It does not depend on us to get going. The day does not start the moment we get out of bed, as if the world were dependent on us. This may bruise our egos, but it does a lot to put us in a more healthy place. Maybe it is not all up to us.

Then there is another point he makes. When God created the heavens and the earth, God said, "It's very good." Very good is wonderful, but it is not perfect. God creates a world that is not quite completely perfect, and that means maybe there is still room for each of us to contribute something. Besides, God created us as God's helpers. We are "co-creators" and we have an opportunity to make our mark on the world.

You just need to remember that your contribution will not need to be perfect, especially if God's part was limited to "very good!" The other gift of this lesson is to never forget that the world goes on without you before you wake up and after you go to sleep. So enjoy this day and all it brings to you. There will never be another one quite like it.

June 20th-24th, 9am -Noon




FOURTH OF JULY PARADE


Father's Day is June 19. Treat Dad to a gift card!
