#### Pastoral Message

Pastor Allen Mothershed

#### The Gift of Listening and Affirming

At that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked, "Who, then, is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" He called a little child to Him, and placed the child among them. And he said: "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Therefore, whoever takes the lowly position of this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. And whoever welcomes one such child in My name welcomes Me."

Matthew 18:1-5

At some point in all of our lives, we have received the amazing gift of having another person simply sit with us and give us their full attention when we most needed it. They have listened without judgment, focused completely on hearing and understanding us without worrying about what they needed to say next. We felt seen, valued, and deeply affirmed by the experience.

In a recent sermon, I referred to my experience of seeing the documentary about Fred Rogers, "Won't You Be My Neighbor?" I was surprised by my emotional response to seeing the way he could enter into the emotional world of a child (or anyone for that matter). His heart was tender and vulnerable, and yet strong and wise. Even enemies or those who were angry were disarmed by the intentional way he heard and affirmed them.

We do not think of such people as powerful and strong. We might even look at someone like Fred Rogers and say he is a weakling. But in the movie, the affirmation of Mr. Rogers by those who knew him and were witness to his life was that he was one of the most powerful people they had ever encountered.

Jesus said that unless we become like children we cannot enter the kingdom of God. It takes the trust, the vulnerability, the openness of a child to receive the gift of grace and forgiveness that God gives.

What would it mean for us to slow down, stop being distracted, stop judging and attempting to fix other people, and just listen and affirm them? What would it mean for each of us to be open to receiving that from others and from the Spirit of Jesus, who hears our prayers and deeply loves and affirms us?

### Living in the World, But Not of the World: Being Faithful in a World at Odds.

All of us have struggled to be ourselves, even when that pulls against friends, family and others who believe differently. How do we make room to allow our more authentic self to emerge? How can we maintain respectful relationships and dialogue with others who see politics, social issues, or religious issues differently? Fortunately, this is not a new struggle, and we can learn from how different communities of faith have worked through this.



Join us for three interfaith presentations on how different people have worked to be true to themselves and/or to their faith when it put them at odds with others. We meet Wednesday nights, September 19th, 26th, and October 3rd, at 7pm in the St. Matthew parlor.

Our September presenters are:

**September 19th** - **Sally Miller** is an ordained United Church of Christ pastor serving as a hospital chaplain. Sally grew up Roman Catholic, became Evangelical, and then a part of the United Church of Christ at First Congregational Church in Glen Ellyn where she discerned a call to ordained ministry.

**September 26th** - **Lauri Teagan** is an active Jewish laywoman who teaches confirmation at her synagogue, Congregation Etz Chaim, in Lombard. She will share the Jewish experience of claiming their identity as a unique religious community, while living in the larger culture.


As we adjust to life A.Q. (after Quinn), we want to reassure everyone that our search for a Youth Director replacement is underway, and we are actively


