<u>Pastoral Message</u> Pastor Allen Mothershed

What Is Truly Impressive

In New York, I once approached one of the city's great cathedrals and was impressed by the enormity and beauty of the structure. I wondered how long it must have taken and the amount of money it would have required to construct such a cathedral of massive stones, carved statues, and beautiful stained-glass. As I was standing there, I noticed an older woman sitting on the steps as people walked by her. She was dressed in tattered clothes. Her hair was combed but looked as if it had been years since she was able to have someone cut and care for it. She was not begging but seemed to have found a resting place, and maybe even a place to feel close to God. I was disturbed by this contrast—such a magnificent place of worship, open to the public for people to gather and worship God, and then this poor woman who no one noticed, except to find a path around her.

This scene brings to mind another scene we find in Mark 12:41-44. Jesus is sitting with His disciples outside the enormous great cathedral of His faith, the Temple, when He notices a poor woman placing money in the donation box. He says to his disciples, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything—all she had to live on." (NIV)

I always heard this taught as a lesson in generosity, which led to an admonition by the pastor to give more generously, just as this poor woman gave. But now I am not so sure that it the lesson of this story. I find myself wondering about the tone in which Jesus said those words. Did He say these words gently? Or did Jesus say the words with an edge of anger and, perhaps, even disgust? Were people so wrapped up in their wealth and pride in donating what they deem as generous, while they pass by this woman, this child of God, without recognizing her needs and her value? She may be leaving and going off to die, and what do they care?

I suspect it is more the latter. Jesus was not just commending this woman and her generosity; He was observing the greed and disregard of a religious institution that has failed to clearly see the worth and value of people who it regards as insignificant. Jesus noticed this woman when others gave her no thought.

What a blessing we receive when we wake up and notice, as Jesus did, those who seem to have so little to contribute and to give, but who God knows and deeply values. What makes a church truly a church of Jesus is our ability to recognize the worth and value of those the world deems a nuisance and unimportant, and not the impressive things we build or achieve. Imagine how impressive a church is when it lives and breathes that way of thinking. How might we go deeper into being that church?

Reopening Update

Thank you to all who responded to our survey about your likelihood to attend indoor worship service. Your responses provided great insight into how people are feeling at this time.

We received 69 responses. Some of those were answering for individuals, and many were answering for their household. So it actually represents far more than 69 people.

Likelihood of attending in November:

- 12 Definitely Will
- 27 Maybe
- 30 Definitely Will Not

Likelihood of attending in December:

- 16 Definitely Will
- 29 Maybe
- 24 Definitely Will Not

In addition, people added some very interesting and heartfelt comments.

From those who are likely to attend:

"I believe that the service should be held in the church for any member who wishes to attend. The service should be about who attends, be it 5 or 50, not about who doesn't attend. If the service touches the heart and soul of only one person, it was worth everything put into it for that one person."

"The longer we stay out, the more people we will lose."

"It's been difficult for our family to stay engaged remotely with church."

"We've been missing our church family so much."

From those who are not likely to attend:

"Since there are bad predictions re: Illinois and the virus, I'm very hesitant to meet in church, even with masks, etc."

"Group gatherings, especially inside, aren't recommended yet."

"I believe it's still too risky to attend, especially with the spike of cases this week."

"Even if CDC/IDPH guidelines are being offered, indoor viral spread is more likely with any size group, especially if not of one's immediate family where one does not know what the other person's association/interaction with others has been."

NEXT STEPS

We will be meeting to decide what is the best path to take at this time, and promise to keep you informed as those difficult decisions are made.

For the past several years, the youth of St. Matthew (and some brave adult chaperones) have participated in this county-wide event and raised necessary funds for Bridge Communities' Transitional Housing Program. Due to the pandemic, this year's event (the 17th Annual SOS) will look very different. We have registered St. Matthew as a participant once again (it is listed as St. Matthew UCC crazies youth group- https://www.bridgecommunities.org/group116), and we encourage donations to our page. The fundraising goal set is \$500. We also have a NEW idea!

Since sleeping out together (either inside or outside) may not be a good idea this year, Bridge Communities is encouraging families, kids, and youth groups to participate but in a safe and socially-distanced way. What they are still stressing is that families right in our community are still experiencing homelessness and food and shelter insecurity, so we really need to support the transitional housing program and the 100+ families served by Bridge.

So...we are hoping all or many of our families will participate in this virtual event (sleeping in their car in their driveway, or in their basement or family room in a box or a tent or a homemade fort). Bridge is choosing **Saturday, November 7th** as the countywide date, but they are urging groups to pick **ANY** day between October 9th and December 5th. Bridge has all sorts of learning materials that they will make available, and the youth will be doing some of these activities during their Zoom. Since so many of us are missing our church family, this event could bring us together and allow for sharing of pictures and ideas. Let's connect virtually, help those in our community in need, and create an empathy-building experience!

This is a good "starter" lesson to the Sunday School year to explore why and how people pray.

Simple Communion Bread

Ingredients:

1 cup all-purpose flour

1/3 cup vegetable oil

1/8 teaspoon salt

1/3 cup water

While any bread or juice will do for Communion, if you like to do something creative, then try this simple communion bread recipe.

Preheat oven to 425 degrees F. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.

Mix flour, oil, and salt together in a bowl; add water and mix using a pastry cutter until dough is soft. Form dough into 6 balls and press into disks onto the prepared baking sheet using your hands.

Bake in the preheated oven until bread is cooked, 8 to 10 minutes.


