#### Pastoral Message

Pastor Allen Mothershed

#### **Our Digital Self Versus Our Body Self**

I am a gadget guy. My attention is easily captured by news articles parading the newest technological developments. I feel rather shallow confessing this slight obsession and distraction. But it's true, I am impressed by innovation, especially new phones with fantastic battery life or extraordinary cameras superior to many SLR cameras. I'm drawn to simplicity and elegant design, maybe because I'm not so technologically savvy. You have to keep it simple for me.

Recently, the Apple credit card took over my thoughts until I applied for one. This seemed to be a no-brainer: no late fees, annual fees, or international fees, lower interest rates, a running account of spending color-coded with graphs, and payments made with a click of a button. I'm overlooking my concern that a massive corporation is attempting to suck up even more power and wealth.

I worry about that. I wonder if we will find a way to break up such power and make sure such companies attend to the common good, like paying a fair share of taxes, paying their people a just wage, and caring for the environment. But hey, I do not want to miss out, and this innovation is rather brilliant. Brilliance and convenience draw me in.

More concerning is how depersonalized we are becoming with new technology and social media. Recently, I read a New York Times commentary by Bianca Vivian Brooks. On her blog she had amassed, for almost a decade, a large number of followers. She reached a point where she realized it had to end. Her private life was being sacrificed for her public one. Her digital self was minimizing her body self. She says, "Social media is no longer a mere public extension of our private socialization; it has become a replacement for it. What happens to our humanity when we relegate our real lives to props for the performance of our virtual ones?"

It's a warning for us not to lose the essential self that is incarnated in a body that can be seen, known, and hugged. When someone laughs, I want to hear it and join the laughter, not type LOL. When someone cries, I want to hand them a tissue, not type a sad face meme on a computer. We are flesh and blood, and we do not fully encounter each other until we are present with our whole self.

John's gospel begins with an amazing affirmation of our body self. "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us." We are not a spirit up in the sky or electronic data on a server. May our "word" not be disembodied and lost as electronic pulses in the neverlands of the web, but embodied in living and breathing, flesh and blood in relationship to each other.

### **MARIAN PARK CHRISTMAS STORE**

St. Matthew will continue our ongoing support for Marian Park's residents by holding our annual Christmas Store in early December. Like last year, we will be asking St. Matthew members to purchase items that many of the Marian Park residents rely on to care for their families/ households. Please watch for our "Giving Tree" in the narthex which will be going up in early November.

We'd ask that you choose one or more items listed on the tree which will be donated to Marian Park for use at the store. You will find that most of the items listed are things that we find common in everyday life, such as household supplies, grooming items (lotion, shampoo, soaps, etc.), diapers, wipes, adult undergarments, and paper products (toilet paper/towels). Unfortunately, such necessities are not eligible for purchase by the Marian Park residents with their SNAP benefits, so our supply of such products is truly helpful.

We will also need 10-15 members of the congregation to help run the store at Marian Park in December.

# St. Matthew United Church of Christ

Please join us in celebrating the 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of St. Matthew United Church of Christ on Sunday, November 17<sup>th</sup> during and after the service.

Our church family has come a long way since our founding members began meeting in a warming shelter in Wheaton in 1959. The warm and welcoming message established by our early members led to growth – resulting in two additions to the original church building and the construction of our 'new' sanctuary in 1989.

During the service on November 17<sup>th</sup>, we will pay tribute to our founding members and learn how St. Matthew has affected the lives of many.

After the service, we will convene in Dobstaff Hall to enjoy brunch, a slideshow, the presentation of artifacts from our history, and play some St. Matthew trivia.

The main dish for the brunch will be provided by Membership/Congregational Life.

We invite members and guests to bring a side to share

(pastries, breads, bagels or fruit).

Please sign up in the narthex by November 10th or call/email Dani de Leon in the office to let us know how many are attending and what you'd like to bring.

As one might expect for an occasion such as a 60th anniversary, our celebration will include special music. The combined choir and handbell ensembles will open the day with an exciting arrangement of "Surely, the Presence of the Lord," commissioned from composer Joel Raney for St. Matthew's 50th anniversary. The congregation will also join in singing during this energetic start to worship. Both groups will also present music thematically tied to the founding of the congregation and Jesus as the foundation of our community, and the band will lead a rousing close to the service.

As part of the celebration, a newly-composed hymn tune will be sung. The tune, composed by organist Brian Dobbelaere, is called "St. Matthew's Double." The name is obviously a reference to the place of its inception, but there was already an existing hymn tune called "St. Matthew," so the metrical length – 8.7.8.7 D, the "D" meaning double – was added. The tune was conceived as an alternate melody to the two principal tunes St. Matthew frequently uses with interchangeable hymn texts selected to match scriptural themes. This new song will actually be used throughout November as a celebration month, using the hymn "God of Love, We Sing Your Glory" by hymn writer Carolyn Winfrey Gillette. We have sung many of her hymns in worship. They have a strong social justice perspective and a rich scriptural poeticism, both of which seem to fit our congregation so well.

We hope that bells, choir, and praise band will lift our congregational spirits as we honor the past, celebrate the present, and look forward to the future and another 60 years and more at St. Matthew.




