More than Tolerant

I've been thinking a lot about the word tolerance. When I was younger and we were going through the racial issues in the South, the idea of being tolerant was a high goal for the people and the communities I knew. But now the word tolerant seems rather weak and unattractive. Just think of how we use that word. We tolerate a headache. We tolerate the traffic jams driving into the city. We tolerate the annoying person talking loud on their cell phone while sitting at the table next to us in a restaurant. To tolerate is to put up with someone we don't like but still may allow for feelings of hatred. Our being tolerant is far better than acting on our more base impulses, but it does not go far in building bridges of love with people different from ourselves.

In Paul's letter to the Galatians, Paul gives the argumentative and conflicting Galatians the list of the fruits of the Spirit: "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control." Tolerance was nowhere in that list. I suppose forbearance is close to tolerance, but Paul adds to that kindness, goodness, and gentleness. That suggests that we are to be far more than a tolerant people.

We need to hear Paul's list of fruits of the Spirit in our church. We have a diversity of people with different ideas, different expectations of worship and church, and quite different political and social views. We are not composed of liberal OR conservative people but liberal AND conservative AND somewhere in between. We have different generations visiting who see the world in alternative ways than previous generations. We are the United Church of Christ, but that does not mean we are a church for only like-minded people.

The idea of church is far different than any other social group. Church is to be the place where we gather and break bread with people unlike us. This was the remarkable quality of the first Christian communities who followed the example of Jesus. They acted just like Jesus, who in love pulled together as ragtag a group of people as you could find on earth. In the Spirit of Christ we work together to be a people who are not afraid to discuss and even argue our differences, but who know how to come together around the same table and lovingly break bread with one another and share the cup of Christ's salvation. Healthy families are not afraid to be different and to discuss differences because at the end of the day they are on each other's side. May we be a healthy family together.



The poem for May from Linda Leinweber, in transition from Kazakhstan to the U.S....

Their Lonely Betters By W. H. Auden, 1951

As I listened from a beach-chair in the shade To all the noises that my garden made, It seemed to me only proper that words Should be withheld from vegetables and birds.

A robin with no Christian name ran through The Robin-Anthem which was all it knew, And rustling flowers for some third party waited To say which pairs, if any, should get mated.

No one of them was capable of lying, There was not one which knew that it was dying Or could have with a rhythm or a rhyme Assumed responsibility for time.

Let them leave language to their lonely betters Who count some days and long for certain letters; We, too, make noises when we laugh or weep: Words are for those with promises to keep.

This poem appealed to me for a couple of reasons. The first is that it points out, somewhat tongue in cheek, the linguistic uniqueness of humans, who, as a result have responsibilities beyond those of nature. The second is that it captures via the beach chair a warm climate, which indeed has also come to Kazakhstan. And finally, it places humanity in a transitional position, in nature, but not totally of nature...and because I, too, am in transition, that appealed to me. I took this from the Norton Anthology of English Literature, Volume 2, but it is pretty widely anthologized. I look forward to seeing you all Memorial Day weekend!




