<u>Pastoral Message</u> Pastor Allen Mothershed

A Word You Can Trust

I recently started a new read, "Journey to Eternity," a personal spiritual travel journey by Timothy Egan, who decided to take a pilgrimage on the Via Francigena, the ancient path from Canterbury, England to Rome, Italy. One of his early stops is in the ancient French town of Saint-Omer, where he explores an ancient scriptorium where monks spent their lives transposing and copying books. A large team of monks would work at their desks from first light until dark for two years on a rare copy of a religious work or a copy of the Bible. The work was holy. The writing was a devoted spiritual practice. Each word is a work of art, every word sacred. Egan points out that this continued for a thousand years until the invention of the printing press. Then books were mass produced and available for many common people.

Today, with the internet, the weight of a word is a tiny leaf in the wind. Words are so diluted in a sea of opinions and ideas that they have lost their potency. Truth is relative and reduced to opinion and manipulation. Words often do not communicate reality as they are bent into falsehoods. Sometimes, outrageous conspiracies are quickly disseminated by eager followers, whose first commitment is not truth but control of a message and gaining power. Today, as never before, we find it more difficult than ever to know who to trust and what to believe. If we feel insecure, a significant reason is that our words have little weight or gravitas. The truth we stand on is on earthquake-prone ground.

In the beginning, God spoke a word and creation came into being. The Word of God was the power of creation. Such a Word had weight, substance, and power. Jesus speaks of this power when He commands His disciples to avoid oaths. He tells us not to swear on heaven or earth. "All you need is to say 'yes' or 'no'; anything else comes from the evil one." We are to be people who speak carefully, like the sort of people we occasionally meet who speak out of silence and with great thought and care. We are to treat words not lightly but as having weight and power. What gives our words power is that we value the truth more than anything. What makes a person believable is that their actions have integrity. What is said is reflected in reality and the actions of the one speaking. As scripture teaches us, we know what is true by the fruit that is produced.

We are living in a time of contradictions about the virus and how to protect ourselves and our world. We need to know what is fact and what is manipulation. Does the one delivering the information have integrity? Are their words proven by clear evidence? Jesus is an example of one whose Word we could trust. As the Gospel of John proclaimed, in Jesus, the Word became flesh. We look to His way, His action as our guide. Through seas of words and nonsense, He speaks the truth. His light reveals both those hiding in the darkness and those who walk in the light. Let us look closely at what is being revealed so we too can walk in the light.



Simple Communion Bread

Ingredients:

1 cup all-purpose flour

1/3 cup vegetable oil

1/8 teaspoon salt

1/3 cup water

While any bread or juice will do for Communion, if you like to do something creative, then try this simple communion bread recipe.

Preheat oven to 425 degrees F. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.

Mix flour, oil, and salt together in a bowl; add water and mix using a pastry cutter until dough is soft. Form dough into 6 balls and press into disks onto the prepared baking sheet using your hands.

Bake in the preheated oven until bread is cooked, 8 to 10 minutes.


