The Only Way, the Only Truth, the Only Life?

Moses said, "Show me your glory." And the Lord said, "I will make all my goodness pass before your face, and I will proclaim the Lord by name before you; I will be gracious to whom I will be gracious, I will show mercy to whom I will show mercy." But he added, "You cannot see my face, for no one can see me and live." The Lord said, "Here is a place by me; you will station yourself on a rock. When my glory passes by, I will put you in a cleft in the rock and will cover you with my hand while I pass by. Then I will take away my hand, and you will see my back, but my face must not be seen."

Exodus 33:19-23

John's gospel says, "I am the Way, the Truth, the Life. No one comes to the Father but by me." These words are often used to claim that our faith is the only true faith. As someone once said to me, "How could Jesus say it any more clearly than that!"

But have you ever wondered: How is it that so many of the world's major religions have so many elements in common such as forgiveness, grace, compassion, justice, and peace? Is it just an accident or is it possible that we as Christians do not have an exclusive claim on God?

Some believe we do have an exclusive claim on God. Wheaton College has just gone through a painful time over the question of whether or not other religions worship the same God as we do. In that debate some ask a helpful question, How could we worship the same God when there are many of our ideas about God which differ? We do well to acknowledge that the faiths of the world do have significant differences in how they experience and think about God.

Attempts to distill a common essence to all the faiths, diminishes the unique expressions of each individual faith

But to say that my understanding of God is the only correct understanding of God is to be guilty of a spiritually dangerous lack of humility. At the core of our faith is the belief that God is ultimately beyond our full grasp, that we are only offered glimpses of God. God is only God, if God is far greater than our ability to understand or control God. In Exodus, we discover that Moses requested that he be given a glimpse of God. God grants him that wish by covering his face as God passes over him. Moses is then allowed to have a glimpse at the backside of God. We also are blessed as Moses was with a glimpse of the living God. If we live and move through the pervasive energy and presence of God in creation, then it makes sense to understand that the great religions of the world each have uncovered their eyes and received a glimpse of God's glory. We experience the same God, but each faith comprehends God in their own way. Not surprisingly, we have common perceptions and also differences.

As Christians, we have our clearest glimpse of God through the birth, life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. He is for us the Way, the Truth, the Life. He is our salvation, our Savior and Lord. This is our experience and our truth to share boldly with all people. When we say Jesus died and was resurrected to reconcile the world, we are saying that Jesus reveals to us the way God works in the world to bring life out of death and to forgive all people. This God we worship is wounded by our injustice and yet still loves and forgives. This is our glimpse of the magnificent glory of God in our world.

(continued) Perhaps the words of Jesus about His being the Way are best taken metaphorically rather than literally. After all, in John's Gospel images always have double meanings, a literal meaning and a metaphorical meaning, with the metaphorical meaning being the profound and essential message. That is to say: wherever people walk in the Way of truth and grace, in the way that leads to fullness of life, Jesus as the Word of God is present. May we walk in the Way God has provided for us and celebrate that God has blessed others as well.

Light snacks and drinks will be provided.







Open & Affirming Update

Our exploration of the Open and Affirming process, which we began in late summer, is now near completion, and the Church Council has set a date for a congregational vote. Here are the dates and next steps to be aware of:


- **-Mid-March** (target date: March 18), a mailing will go out to each member household. This mailing will include the text of our proposed Open and Affirming statement as well as supplemental materials containing additional information and a proxy ballot for members who will be absent the day of the vote.
- -April 3, after worship we will hold a forum for those needing additional information or wishing to discuss the proposed statement, the process or any other issues leading up to the vote the following week.
- -April 10, in the sanctuary after worship will be the formal vote by paper ballot, open to all who hold official membership in our congregation. This date will be for the vote only, with no further discussion before the vote is taken.
