How much is in the bank? Will there be enough to pay the credit card bill that you just received in the mail? Are we meeting our savings goals? Will we have what we need when tuition costs come due? Can my life savings see me through to the end of my retirement? Money can make us all anxious.

We have lots of different attitudes toward money. For some, maybe most, having money bestows on us a degree of status. To have it and enough of it is a sign that we have done well in the world and we feel we can be included in the crowd we like to run with. Others are private with their money because they hate the idea of money being a significant factor in how they judge themselves or other people. Often, in the church, money and financial well-being are considered a necessary evil. We may think of money as dirty when compared to more spiritual matters. When the church brings up money in worship, it is a breach of the sacred with the profane. "Ok, do what you have to, but let's get back to God and worship as quickly as possible."

From the Christian faith perspective there is another way of seeing money. If we read our Scriptures closely we will discover that the Christian faith is materialist. "The earth is the Lord's and all that is within it." This world belongs to God and has been shared with us. Possessions and also money are part of God's grace. We receive what we have and give thanks. The only real issue with money in the Scriptures is our willingness to receive it as a gift. Gifts are not solely to be grasped by the receiver, but are also meant to be shared. We are called not to see possession of wealth as "mine and keep your hands off" like children in a playroom. We are called to see our wealth as providing for what we need and an opportunity to share with others who are in need.

A former member of a church I served said to me, "I just cannot bring myself to retire. I make a lot of money and my real joy in life is that I have an opportunity to give so much away." That's the attitude of generosity. I hope his attitude is contagious.





ST. MATTHEW SAFETY TEAM

Today, most organizations such as schools, places of worship and workplaces have formal safety policies that address how to respond to various emergencies. Types of emergencies include fire, weather, medical, environmental or intruder.

St. Matthew is in the process of developing and implementing a safety policy that will provide guidance on how to respond to emergencies and will provide recommendations on how to improve safety.

Rick Jungk is leading the project to develop our safety policy and needs people to help create and implement the policies. Please let Rick know if you would be willing to participate in this project or provide recommendations to the team.

As part of this project, the Wheaton Police Department has conducted a site survey to review our physical security infrastructure and has made some recommendations on how to improve our physical security. We are going to start implementing some of the recommendations that are easy and inexpensive to do. We will lock all of the doors when our Sunday service starts and someone will be posted at the doors to admit people. You will also start to see some new signage in the church that will address things like evacuation routes, safe areas and the numbering of exterior doors.


