Ash Wednesday - Taize Worship Service

We'll be worshiping tonight in the style of Taize. The Taize community is an ecumenical Christian monastery in France. Taizé music highlights simple phrases, usually lines from the Psalms or other pieces of scripture, sung repeatedly. The repetition is designed to help meditation and prayer. We will share in several short scripture readings and there will be a time of silence, about a minute's time after each reading. Relax into the silence.

Please take time now, if you have not already done so, to be in a quiet place where you will not be interrupted. Have a bit of oil for anointing each other or yourself on your forehead or wrist. If you wish, have a bit of fine dirt or dust to make the sign of the cross on others or yourself on your forehead or wrist. Have both bread and juice ready for the communion portion of the service.
