<u>Pastoral Message</u> Pastor Allen Mothershed

I Have Overcome the World

Today, in my front yard, a transformation of beauty is taking place for anyone who takes the time to notice. Our maple tree, which is centered between the road and the sidewalk, is changing from the green leaves of summer to a rainbow of fall colors. Every year we look for its transformation. In the best years, the brilliance of the colors is so stunning that more than once I have seen people walking by taking time to admire this work of God. Another time a man was across the street capturing the tree's transformation with his cell phone camera.

Sometimes we will pick up one of these multi-color leaves and leave it in a visible place to enjoy. Winter is coming and fall is a reminder of this. I've always loved fall as a break from the hot humidity and the mosquitos I feel I must be on guard to swat and destroy before they steal a taste of me. It is winter that I have hated and dreaded. I remember experiencing my first cold Chicago winter winds that cut through my poor quality, thin Southerner's coat. I wondered what sort of people would intentionally live in such an unfriendly area of the country. I complained and wondered for a time about my decision to move to such an area.

My classmates, most of whom grew up delighted with cold and the snow that allowed snowball fights and sledding, laughed at my lack of preparedness. "Where's your hat? Why don't you wear warm gloves? You need a windproof, warm coat. Put on silks. You are not in the South anymore, deal with it!" Silly me. I started dressing for my new surroundings and learned to adjust. Another friend points out how I treated the cold wind and weather as if it were a personal vendetta against me. She said, "You scrunch up your shoulders and run from building to building as if you are being shot at. Make friends with winter. Lean into the gift of this time of your life. Hold out your arms and take joy in its beauty. Go out and play in the weather and you might discover that it is not an enemy but a friend."

"Lean into what you resist" is a truism that applies to all aspects of our life. Stop running and avoiding what must be faced. Pain is a part of life. Struggle and conflict are never far away. Fear only gathers power when we avoid facing it and finding our options. So much of suffering comes from our refusal to deal with what needs to be dealt with. And then, most importantly, remember what Jesus tells us: "In this world you have many troubles. But take heart. I have overcome the world." John 16:33. Amen.

We only conduct one such campaign per year to solicit pledges that fund our annual operating budget and to seek volunteers for the many Church ministries and activities. Stewardship packets have been mailed, which contain a pledge card and a *Giving at St. Matthew* document to help individuals and families discern their contribution. **Pledge cards can be returned during the service on November 4th (Commitment Sunday) or mailed to the church office.**

Here is what we hope to have happen this year:

- That those of us who do not give financially on a regular basis will take a small step of faith and do so for the first time. We need you with the rest of us, and letting go will be a real experience in trust and expanding your heart. What you put out into the world has a way of coming back to your own life.
- That each of us will give out of joy, rather than fear or guilt. It is more blessed to give than to receive. So many of us know this from years of experience.
- That we'll celebrate our life together at St. Matthew on November 4th and dedicate our "best estimates of giving" pledge cards. If you are unable to attend, you can mail your commitment to the church office, attention Financial Secretary.

So much good is happening at St. Matthew, and in the coming year we have areas which will need additional support, such as:

- greater visibility and increased hours with Mel Jerome, our new youth minister
- stipends for one or two college music students to enhance our choirs
- a growing and expanded Christian Education program

We continue to live out our statement, "No matter who you are or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome and accepted here". Thanks for being a part of our unique Christian community in Wheaton and our surrounding communities. You are making a difference!

MARIAN PARK CHRISTMAS STORE



St. Matthew will continue our ongoing support for Marian Park's residents by holding our second annual Christmas Store in early December. Like last year, we will be asking St. Matthew members to purchase items that many of the Marian Park residents rely on to care for their families/ households. Please watch for our "Giving Tree" in the narthex which will be going up in early November.

We'd ask that you choose one or more items listed on the tree which will be donated to Marian Park for use at the store. You will find that most of the items listed are things that we find common in everyday life, such as household supplies, grooming items (lotion, shampoo, soaps, etc.) diapers, wipes, adult undergarments, and paper products (toilet paper/towels). Unfortunately, such necessities are not eligible for purchase by the Marian Park residents with their SNAP benefits, so our supply of such products is truly helpful.

We will also need 10-15 members of the congregation to help run the store at Marian Park in December.



Guzman family update and letter

An important mission at St. Matthew is nurturing and maintaining our relationship with the Guzman family in San Pedro Sula, Honduras. In 2001, while building homes in Honduras, God led us to Catalina Guzman and her three children, Claudeth, Cinthia and Daniel. This hard-working mother and her children were living in very poor and unsafe conditions when we met them. Since that time, St. Matthew members have generously donated funds to help the Guzman family in a number of ways. We have worked alongside the family to build them a new and safer home and we sent Daniel and Claudeth to private school in order to break their cycle of poverty. With each visit to Honduras and each visit that Daniel and Claudeth have made to the US our relationship with the family grows. Since graduating, Daniel is working for Comcast in Honduras and attending the university at night. Claudeth is in the process of looking for a job. In Honduras, where 80% of the population lives below poverty level, we have been led to help others with houses, medical bills, medicine, food, school supplies, clothes, building materials and more. Because of a woman's prayer for help and a church's love for mission, a bridge has been built across the miles, showing that short term mission trips can lead to long term relationships when we allow God to lead our way.


We look forward to introducing him in worship soon. Welcome, Mel!


