PASTORAL MESSAGE Rev. Allen Mothershed

"A PEBBLE UNDER THE FOOT OR A ROCK TO THE HEAD?"

Back when I was a young United Methodist pastor, I heard a respected older Bishop who was the preacher for the week at the Mississippi Annual Conference. He was preaching a sermon on the need for humility. With great emotion and dramatics, he stepped out from behind the pulpit and pointed to his shoe. He took one shoe off, took out a tiny pebble and held it up for us to see. Then he said, "Every step," he explained to us, "every single step I take, this pebble that I keep in my shoe is God's little reminder that I am a human being like everybody else."

Well, my first thought was "that's gotta hurt." My second was, "Why would you do that to yourself?" My third was "man, I don't need a painful pebble reminding me of my humanity, the world is doing a very good job at that." To be truthful, I thought he and his sermon were a bit too sanctimonious, but I have to admit, he made his point and he made enough of an impression for me to share this with you decades later.

Life has its way of bringing us all back down to earth. The trouble is that sometimes it can feel more like a rock to the head than a pebble under our foot. We lose a job; we receive bad news from our doctor; a friend or a loved one dies; or a relationship is in danger of being lost. The Apostle Paul says we are troubled, we are in doubt, we have enemies, we can be badly hurt at times. And Paul is one to know. How many times was he shipwrecked, beaten, deeply disappointed, sick to the point of death? He also talked about having a thorn in the flesh which he had to learn to live with, one that God would not take away from him.

Paul was a realist. He was not attempting to act like being a Christian would exempt him from the harder realities of this life. In fact, his experience was that it was because he was Christian that he exposed himself to some of the more painful experiences of life. But he goes on to say, "We are often troubled, but not crushed; sometimes in doubt, but never in despair; there are many enemies, but we are never without a friend; and though badly hurt at times, we are not destroyed." (Read 2 Corinthians 4:7-12)

His image is that of clay pots. We are clay pots. Not a bad image. Sooner or later, we realize that we are just that fragile, temporal, mortal. But he goes on to say, we are a clay pot filled with an amazing treasure, the good news of God which is the power of life over death. The gift of faith is also the gift of resilience and hope.

It's Official: We have adopted a mile of the Illinois Prairie Path!

In our effort to be good stewards of the planet and take responsibility for a part of our community, we have adopted a 1-mile stretch of the Main Branch of the Illinois Prairie Path. This section begins in downtown Wheaton at West Street and extends east to President Street. The mile section that runs behind the church property had

already been claimed by another group, although that was our first choice. A sign will be posted at the start of our mile crediting us with the clean-up (GOOD and free PR)!

We must agree to pick up trash/debris from this section of the path a minimum of 4 times between April 1 and November 1. Our first date was in May and we have committed to the following dates to complete our commitment for 2017 (and can re-schedule with advance notice):

MANNA/SCRIP UPDATE

The Manna Group Scrip Company, located in Palatine, has been purchased by Great Lakes Scrip Center, based in Grand Rapids, Michigan. You can check out their website at www.shopwithscrip.com.

We have started placing our orders with Great Lakes Scrip and new order forms have been uploaded to our website (Donate/Pennies from Heaven page). The Manna/Scrip cards are

now being shipped from Grand Rapids and arrive later in the week. The cards should be available for early pickup by Thursday afternoon or at the Manna/Scrip table on the following Sunday as usual.

However, if you register on shopwithscrip.com and choose the PrestoPay option (direct withdrawals from your bank account), you can order your own cards online or from your cell phone. Selected cards can be reloaded as well.

Happy June everyone! We've finally reached that time of year when people stop complaining about the cold and rain and start complaining about it being too hot and humid. Praise God!


