A Simple Faith

Sometimes the greatest accomplishments of faithful Christians, whose lives and works we remember so many centuries later, have nothing to do with having a new idea or developing a new theology. This is true for St. Francis of Assisi, the great saint who many believe was the holiest man to ever walk the earth, other than Jesus, whom he followed. We don't have many of his writings. He never verbally or theologically challenged the church, of which he was a part, even though it had become grossly corrupt and far from reflecting the faith and way of Jesus. He had a moment in his life when he heard God speaking to him through Holy Scripture. He listened and did exactly what God told him to do. "Go and sell all that you have and give to the poor." He did just as he was told and, by doing that, he changed the world and lived a joyful life.

It was a simple idea. Take a few of the words of Jesus literally and trust that the promises He attached to them would be the absolute truth. This is not usually a good idea. Lots of troubled people wade into deeper, darker waters as literalists. But these words for this man were the keys to paradise.

Sometimes you get to a place where the only path you can take is one that begins with an enormous jump, like a baby bird's first leap off the branch. St. Francis took the leap, and he soared.

We are in a new year, a new beginning. What if we listened more closely to what God's words are to us this year and, simply, with great attentiveness and commitment, put them into practice?

<u>Did You Know??</u> <u>Meals on Wheels is</u> a SMUCC ministry!

One of the ongoing ministries here at St.

Matthew is our 25+ year involvement with the Meals on Wheels Program run by the DuPage Senior Citizens Council. Our dedicated team (currently about 11 people) shares a route two days a week (currently Mondays and Fridays). We pick up anywhere between 6 and 10 hot meals (and sometimes frozen meals) at Marian Park and deliver them to seniors and others who are homebound.

Simple Communion Bread

Ingredients:

1 cup all-purpose flour

1/3 cup vegetable oil

1/8 teaspoon salt

1/3 cup water

While any bread or juice will do for Communion, if you like to do something creative, then try this simple communion bread recipe.

Preheat oven to 425 degrees F. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.

Mix flour, oil, and salt together in a bowl; add water and mix using a pastry cutter until dough is soft. Form dough into 6 balls and press into disks onto the prepared baking sheet using your hands.

Bake in the preheated oven until bread is cooked, 8 to 10 minutes.


