### **Our Blessed Place in Creation**

This month in worship, we have been talking about reclaiming our original blessing; the blessing God gave all of creation after God rested on the 7th day and said, "it's good, it's very good." The source of evil is that we forget our original blessing and fail to understand the gracious gift we have been given. Creation spirituality does not ask us to rise above who we are but to claim the goodness of being created human and to see that goodness in others and in all of creation. This poem is an invitation to embrace your place in God's whole. I invite you to meditate on it.






